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Our Hospital and the Community Served

About Wellfound Behavioral Health Hospital

Wellfound Behavioral Health Hospital is a joint venture between Virginia Mason Franciscan Health and Multicare Health System, as a collaborative response to the emerging behavioral health needs of Pierce County residents. The facility is a freestanding, two-story, behavioral health hospital with 120 inpatient beds. The hospital opened in 2019 and provides voluntary and involuntary admissions with a focus on general adult psychiatric care.

Our Mission

Mission: To facilitate the development of a full continuum of integrated, high value, behavioral health services for the South Sound communities.

Financial Assistance for Medically Necessary Care

Wellfound Behavioral Health Hospital delivers compassionate, high quality, affordable health care and advocates for members of our community who might have difficulty accessing and paying for necessary medical care. In furtherance of this mission, the hospital provides financial assistance to eligible patients who do not have the capacity to pay for medically necessary health care services, and who otherwise may not be able to receive these services. Description of the Community Served

Wellfound Behavioral Health Hospital is located in Tacoma, WA. The entirety of Pierce County was used as the service area for the hospital. A summary description of the community is below. Additional details can be found in the CHNA report online.

Pierce County includes 900,700 residents, mostly White (64%), followed by Hispanic (11.2%), Asian (7.3%), Black (7.2%), and Multiracial (6.7%) with an increasing number of adults 55- 74 years of age. Immigrants in Pierce County originated from Asia, Latin America, and Europe.

Community Assessment and Significant Needs

Wellfound Behavioral Health Hospital engages in multiple activities to conduct its community health improvement planning process. These include, but are not limited, to conducting a Community Health Needs Assessment in collaboration with Virginia Mason Franciscan Health, MultiCare Health System and the Pierce County Department of Health, with community input, identifying collaborating community stakeholder organizations, describing anticipated impacts of program activities and measuring program indicators.

Community Assessment

Wellfound Behavioral Health Hospital engaged in multiple activities to conduct its community health improvement planning process. This evaluation of impact outlines many of the programs that hospital supported, either through financial or in-kind support, that addressed the health needs identified in the CHNA.

Significant Health Needs

From 2019 through 2022, Wellfound Behavioral Health Hospital focused on the following priority health needs:

- 1. Access to Care
- 2. Suicide
- 3. Drug and alcohol use
- 4. Obesity
- 5. Depression
- 6. Unintentional injuries

Actions Taken

The following section outlines the actions Wellfound Behavioral Health Hospital took since the completion of the 2019 CHNA.

- The hospital continued to build capacity and expand mental health access in the Puget Sound region.
- Expanded Payor contracting to as many plans as possible
- Continued to support charity care for any needed patient
- Continued to offer free 24/7 intake assessments.
- Continued to provide suicide free assessment for all who walk-in
- Explored offering a social medial for depression awareness campaign
- Continued to offer initial drug / alcohol assessments
- Maintain access to community certified drug / alcohol team
- Continued to provide discharge planning to SUD treatment facilities
- Explored opportunity to provide depression seminars to the community
